The Lowell Metropolitan Police Commission met in regular session on March 10th, 2016 at the Lowell Town Hall.

Chief Matson informed the Commission that the applicant orientation was held on February 13th and that 95 people were in attendance. He also stated that 28 applicants had turned in applications thus far, and he is expecting more before the deadline tomorrow.

Chief Matson thanked the Officers for a job well done during the blizzard on February the 24th. He also thanked Tri Creek School Corporation Superintendent Debra Howe and Three Creeks Elementary School for their assistance with housing and feeding stranded motorists overnight.

Chief Matson informed the Commission that the Town Council gave the Police Department permission to purchase two new Police vehicles from the CCD funds. He also stated that the vehicles were purchased from Thomas Dodge for the same price as the vehicles purchased last year, and that one vehicle is in the process of getting equipment installed and the other vehicle was ordered and will be here around June or July.

President Piper thanked Chief Matson, Asst. Chief Woestman, and the Officers of the Lowell Police Department for a job well done taking care of Lowell citizens and stranded motorists during the Blizzard.


XI. ANNOUNCEMENTS
