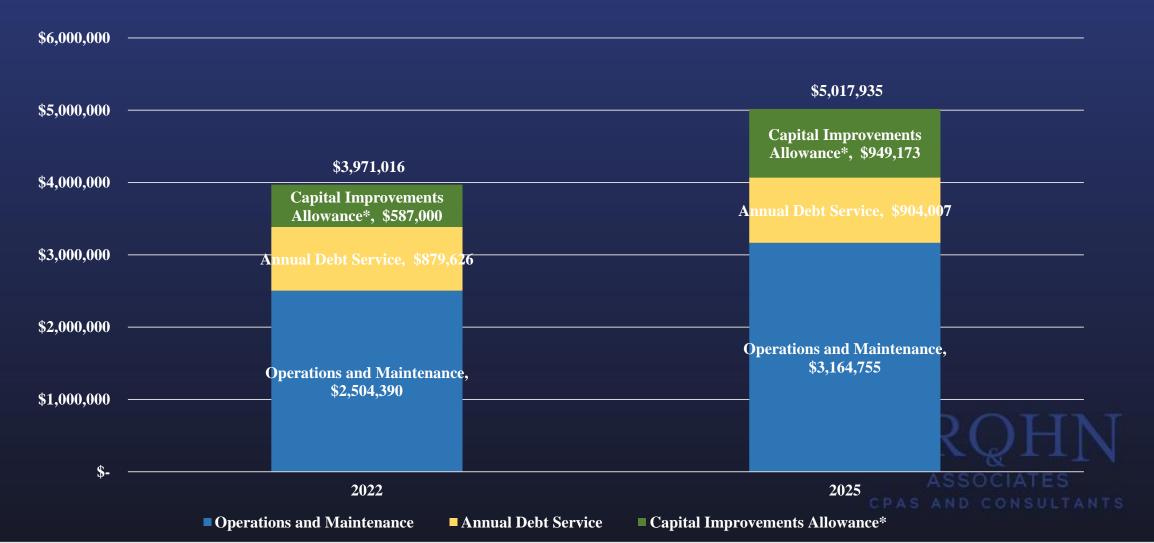

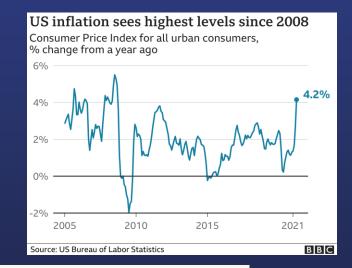
#### COMPARISON OF PRIOR AND CURRENT REVENUE REQUIREMENTS



#### **Public Hearing – 2025 Wastewater Rates**

#### • **3 Major Factors in Revenue Requirements:**

- OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE:
  - 26% increase since over 2022 requirements
    - Inflation of 17.7% has been experienced since 2022
    - Additional overhead requirements pursuant to water utility sale
      - However, benefits from sale have provided significant cashflows to the Town for various projects
    - Increase in required services to maintain growing sewer system and customer base larger general system
- ANNUAL DEBT SERVICE:
  - Proposed increase due to proposed bonds for increased needs in environmental requirements and proposed projects at plant, plus improvements to collection system to address current infiltration and inflow issues
- CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS ALLOWANCE:
  - Due to new environmental requirements and an aging wastewater system, significant upgrades and improvements are needed at the plant as well as period upgrades to collection system
  - Proposed improvements allowance provides for the accumulation or expenditure of \$949,000 annually

#### **Town of Lowell**

- Multiple Ways to Apply Charges
  - Historically, the Utility has charged services for a base service charge plus a flow charge dependent on water usage
  - The Proposed Charges authorize the implementation of a flat rate to more equitably apply to the impact on plant and collection system requirements
  - Additionally, the flat rate removes the dependence on Indiana-American water meter readings, which have been unreliable in the past few years

### • SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT CHARGES

- Designed to provide cash funding for future capital needs (capacity and extension) and/or to provide an equity payment into the existing system
- Three ways to calculate:
  - Incremental cost method (growth/capacity requirements)
  - Equity method (existing system requirements)
  - Combination (growth/capacity and existing system requirements)
- Not eligible for debt service coverage calculations, should be determined completely independent of wastewater rates and charges
- However, net impact effectively drives down rates required by providing cash funding that would otherwise have to be assessed through rates and charges
